

Speaker Richard T. Kaczkowski, P.E. will discuss how property damages from nearby blasting or construction events are a common complaint, particularly in congested urban areas. This presentation compiles information from numerous past forensic investigations of damage claims. It addresses common risk sources, threshold vibration levels which may cause damage to various types of structures (including concrete and masonry construction), how human perception of vibration can influence damage claims, and steps that may be taken to minimize damage risk.

He has conducted hundreds of structural and building envelope investigations to diagnose the cause of construction problems or damages, and to remedy them.
